### From the Rabbi's Desk



This October, we have something very special. It coincides with a month of Jewish holidays. It is later than in many years, but this month, we have a chance to embrace our heritage, beliefs, and way of life with both arms.

We will begin on October 3rd with Rosh Hashana when we will inaugurate the year 5785 and inaugurate a new Jewish year. This is a time of coronation for Hashem and a chance to reawaken the purest and truest sense of ourselves.

The Talmud teaches that everyone is judged on this day, and all mankind is seen and examined for the coming year. We awaken ourselves with the blasts of the Shofar as we spend the day in joyful prayer, interspersed with festive meals.

October 12th will be the High Holy Day of Yom Kippur. We will have the most treasured opportunity to seek forgiveness for all our transgressions from the previous year. Fasting and prayer will help us commit to a new year and a new sense of being. It is a time for reflection and soul searching and ultimately a happy time as we come back to our deepest sense of goodness and holiness.

Finally, on October 17, we begin Sukkot. We will eat and dwell in our beautiful sukkah for seven days as we rejoice in Hashem's protection of the world and celebrate this joyous holiday. We wave the four species around to recall that Hashem is everywhere and directs all life. At the end, we will celebrate Shmini Atzeret and Simchat Torah. This will mark the anniversary of the terrible massacres that occurred on Simchat Torah one year ago in Israel. While we will still dance and celebrate the holiday as is fitting, the victims will not be far from our hearts. To commemorate, we will have a new Torah cover from Israel for our shul emblazoned with the Israeli flag and the name of one of the victims.

Please join us this month to pray, to sing, to reflect and to grow and celebrate.

May we all be blessed with a happy, healthy and sweet new year!
