From the Rabbi's Desk



Welcome to March! This month, we will celebrate Purim, a joyous and festive day whose excitement and holiness will take us right into Passover. Purim represents a triumph of Jewish people over their adversaries and a recommitment to Jewish observance. One of the primary Mitzvos of the day is the reading of the Megillah of Esther. We recount the wondrous story of the Persian court where the Jews were miraculously saved from the wicked Haman. Possibly the most celebrated and famous character of the Megillah is Queen

Esther. We don't often have Holidays where the primary hero is a woman. Yet, Esther, with her faith, cunning, and providential placement, was able to be a vehicle for G-d's salvation of the Jewish people.

We often make the mistake of thinking that Men have a more primary role in Judaism than women. Although Men lead services and have certain obligations that women do not, women are no less valuable than men. In fact, our sages tell us that it was because of the righteous women in Egypt that the Jewish people merited the Exodus and the events of Passover. Queen Esther is a prime example of a Jewish heroine, and she reminds us that women play a key role in Jewish life and destiny.

In these last few months of hostage releases, we have been overjoyed to see some of our hostages come back alive. Although they endured unspeakable horrors, they have been blessed to survive. I have been particularly amazed by the strength of the young female Jewish hostages that endured captivity. Twenty-year-old Agam Berger spoke openly about her faith and her dedication to observing Judaism under hellish conditions. She certainly portrays the modern spirit of Esther and represents the greatness of Jewish women.

As we look forward to Purim, I hope you will join us for our celebration. We will read the Megillah both night and day, have a festive meal, and give gifts and charity to our fellows. All this will happen before we go into another beautiful Shabbat at Park Plaza.
